

October 24-31 is International Bat Week!

Bat Week is an annual, international celebration of the role of bats in nature.*

Why do bats matter?

- Over 1,400 species worldwide (make up 1/5 of all mammalian species).
- 70% of bats eat insects!!
 - Bats can eat their bodyweight in insects in one night.
 - Bats save farmers \$23 billion every year.
- Some bats eat fish, nectar, pollen, blood, rodents, frogs, and even other bats.

Amazing bat facts

- The Bumblebee Bat is the world's smallest bat and weighs less than a penny
- The Giant Golden-crowned Flying Fox is the largest bat, with a 6 foot wingspan
- The Mexican free-tailed bat is the fastest bat and can reach 100 mph!
- Bats are the only flying mammal.
- South Carolina has 14 species of bat, one of which is listed as federally threatened.
